KEYNOTE ADDRESS:

Voice of Reason: What Happened to the Center?

Alan Abramowitz, Ph. D.

Alben W. Barkley Professor of Political Science, Emory University



Renowned political scientist and native Long Islander, Alan I. Abramowitz, author of *The Disappearing Center*, presents a groundbreaking argument that the most important divide in American politics is not between left and right but rather between citizens who are politically engaged and those who are not. It is the engaged members of the public, he argues, who most closely reflect the ideals of democratic citizenship—but this is also the group that is most polarized. Alan Abramowitz will discuss the broader changes in American politics, the implications for Long Island and New York State and the outlook for the critical National and State elections in November.

The Sandy Lenz Community Service Award, presented in memory of *James Harnett, President/CEO Family & Childrens Association*

In April of 1991 Long Island lost a long time advocate for the poor with the death of former Council President David Kadane. The Health and Welfare Council Board of Directors chose to honor the memory of this leader by establishing the David Kadane Award. The Award is given to an individual who best exemplifies David's tenacious advocacy for justice.
